The History OF ANZA Soccer

- Established from ANZUK Junior Football as the ANZA International Junior Football League in 1976. (ANZU disbanded# in Dec.1974)
- ANZA IJSL is the largest member-supported in-house league in Southeast Asia, with 1000 participants (800 Players, 200 Coaches/Support)
- ANZA IJSL is currently still an all-volunteer organization
- After many years of residence at the Portsdown Road pitches, ANZA Soccer became an almost nomadic group of tribes before settling at the Turf City pitches in 2005-2006, but now faces the serious challenge of a short term lease.
- The world has changed since 1976. With its traditional charter of supporting a spirit of non-competition, ANZA Soccer faces many challenges presented by the complex psycho-social changes of the New Millennium, and is rising to those challenges:

- The SEA Cup Tournament is the traditional top competition for ANZA Soccer since 1988. Competitors are Jakarta Youth Soccer, Kuala Lumpur Youth Soccer and Bangkok Soccer League. The competition will be expanded in 2011 to include a team from Philippines, and a demonstration participation by a women's teams from Cambodia.
- The FAS COE Challenge Cup is an annual event held for the Singapore Soccer Centers of Excellence. This year, based on our progress in the development of youth soccer, ANZA Soccer was invited to send teams in the U-16 and U-18 age divisions. Other teams competing came from the S-League clubs and the 2 largest and most successful youth football academies in Singapore.
- ESPzen is a men's league run commercially, with up to 11 divisions playing on Sundays, and additionally on other days of the week. On their website, they describe themselves as offering a platform for individuals, small and large companies, and social groups, to network and improve their physical fitness while enjoying the world's most popular sport. They also state that they are dedicated to revolutionizing amateur football in Singapore through their interactive website.
